



Warning Signs of ADD/ADHD

The symptoms of ADD/ADHD vary greatly. All people display some of these symptoms, some of the time. However, people who *frequently* display these symptoms, may be displaying signs of ADD or ADHD. This is especially true if their behavior is not *age* and *situation-appropriate*, and is *interfering* with their ability to be successful in school or at work.
